Why

Our societies are in transition. Addressing complex issues such as cultural transition or social cohesion requires both intangible and tangible solutions, both services and artefacts, design and systemic thinking ("matter" and "meta").

NARI

NART is an international artist residency and consists of the former director's villa, KREENHOLM garden community and a small plot in nearby Kulgu.



Content

This (service) design workshop will explore transition spaces of NART art residency and urban Narva and use photography and mapping techniques as research tools and field work. Focusing on problem seeking and system thinking, the workshop will combine artisticdocumentary work with analytical tools and critical discourse. The starting challenge is:

"How might the NART (Kreenholm director's villa & Kreenholm community garden) and the new Kulgu area plot (aka Narva Venice area) serve as an integrated hub for local community building, cultural & art mediation and multi-language exposure?"

On the opening day we will exchange various aspects of transition, their problematics and their root causes, mapping involved parties and their goals. Transitions may involve language barriers and socio-political reform processes. urban artifacts and architectures, actual public space indoors and outdoors, experiences of conviviality and places of segregation. We will then decide which problems and places to work with.

From NART as our starting point we will then explore the NART ecosystem and its entangled communities, taking photographs, drawing, making interviews, observing and participating in urban life. Concentrically we will explore ever wider parts of Narva, searching for signs and places of transition and possible points of intervention.

Narva

Narva has a predominantly Russian speaking population, but transition is underway with an educational reform stipulating a shift to Estonian in local schools within the next few years. Within this context, NART is a window to the world in a town that sees itself as a secluded place at Estonia's fringe with a sense of locally patriotic pride.
